

The University Student Center will be formed for the specific purpose of serving the educational needs of California State University, Northridge. This \$7.5 million student union will be the primary co-curricular facility on the campus at Northridge. The planning for the Center is currently in the working drawing stage of the architectural sequence. If there are no delays during the completion of working drawings or during the advertising and awarding of bids, construction of the Center will begin in March of 1974. Construction of the building will take from 18 to 22 months depending on the weather, strikes, etc. If all goes well, the Center will be ready for occupancy either late 1975 or early 1976.

The following facilities will be part of the Center's offerings: music and browsing lounges, art gallery, multi-purpose auditoria, food service, billiards room, donut and ice cream shop, arts and crafts room, swimming pool and coffee house. Concerts, exhibits, symposiums, lectures, outings, tournaments, film series, and fairs are examples of some of the other proposed activities that the Center will be involved with.
